Licensed Practical Nurses

Are you self-directed and highly motivated, but due to personal circumstances such as family or work unable to pursue a Registered Nurse credential offered strictly during the day or at night? If so, Jefferson Community and Technical College may have the answer. The College is now offering an online LPN-Associate Degree Nursing Program which prepares graduates to take the NCLEX-RN exam for licensure as a Registered Nurse. This hybrid, flexible program provides all coursework online in a modularized format with the exception of labs and clinicals which are held either on campus or in traditional healthcare settings in the Louisville area or in West Kentucky for those who live in that area. Students are guided step-by-step through the program by skilled nurse educators prepared to facilitate online nursing education. Interested, but need more information?
